Giving Hope Through Hygiene

Mobile Shower Trailer Initiative in Osceola County

The Hope Partnership's mission is to provide a holistic continuum of care in order to end homelessness and poverty in Central Florida. They achieve this by bridging connections between service providers and clients.

In 2022, AdventHealth funded needed repairs to the Hope Partnership's mobile shower trailer. Since completing the repairs, the Hope Partnership has seen a steady increase in attendance at their weekly events and over 700 showers have been taken. Each week, the Hope Partnership has a Hope Cares Day and attendance has increased to 60-90 people per event.

Perhaps most importantly, these showers function as an entry point for individuals in need of other health and wellness services. Other agencies such as Orange Blossom Family Health, Homeless Services Network, Osceola Council on Aging, and Second Harvest Food Bank are partners with Hope Partnership to offer things like well visits, food access, and housing.





Treating Addiction with Whole-Person Care

The Hope & Healing Center, located in Sanford, is part of a partnership between AdventHealth, the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, Seminole County EMS/Fire Rescue, and the Board of County Commissioners. The partnership intends to transform the way people struggling with opioid addiction are treated by the health care and criminal justice systems. AdventHealth currently provides in-kind support to the Hope and Healing Center and over 20 AdventHealth employees donate time to provide a wide array of services.

"We are transforming how we view and treat people with substance-use disorders," said Tim Cook, Senior Vice President and Chief Mission Integration Officer at AdventHealth. "We need to see the whole person, not just the addiction."

Andrew, a patient at the Hope & Healing Center, shared that "It was, hands down, the best experience I have had at a rehab, with personalized care and attentiveness... At the end of the day, EVERYONE at Hope and Healing is amazing, and played an integral part in my sobriety, which is now coming up on 2 years!"
