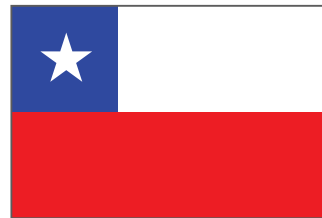


AdventHealth Global Mission Footprints

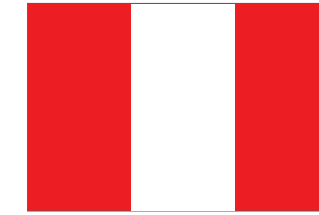


Nepal

In 2022, Scheer Memorial Adventist Hospital completed the renovations for their operating suite, which included OR lights, an anesthesia machine and an overall renovation of the surgical and endoscopy space. Additionally, a need for a new CT scanner was identified for the hospital to enhance their services and fulfill the hospital mission "to provide compassionate care to all patients regardless of their ability to pay." In Memoriam

C. Steve Yancey (1941-2022)

On July 29, 2022, AdventHealth Global Missions lost a friend, a cheerleader, and its founder as Steve Yancey passed away to his rest in Jesus Christ. Steve was passionate about serving wherever God directed. That passion led Steve to serve not just the communities of Central Florida through his work at Florida Hospital, now AdventHealth, but also communities in many countries around the world. He worked tirelessly to make the world a better place. He led numerous mission trips and established partnerships with healthcare organizations in many different countries. If you visit the Summit Clinic at the Kalala Learning Village in Ethiopia, you will see a clinic building that Steve was instrumental in constructing. If you travel to Andrews Memorial Hospital in Jamaica, you will see an Intensive Care Unit and Operating Rooms that have his fingerprints on them. If you visit the Operating Rooms at Clinica Americana in Juliaca, Peru or the hospital tower at Clinica Good Hope in Lima, Peru, you will see Steve's influence on those projects. These are just a few examples of the projects that demonstrated his long-term commitment and involvement with mission hospitals and the communities they serve. These relationships served as the basis for the creation of Global Mission Initiatives, a department at Florida Hospital now called AdventHealth Global Missions, that has helped build a culture of generosity and volunteerism and continues Steve's legacy of service. Steve was a true pioneer, and his work will continue to inspire and benefit countless individuals and communities around the world.

Another lasting impact that Steve established is the “mission warehouse” managed by AdventHealth Global Missions. Hospitals in many countries around the world (Belize, Jamaica, Dominican Republic, the Philippines, Venezuela, Peru, Chile, Guatemala, Chad, Puerto Rico, Haiti and more) have benefited from receiving donated medical equipment and supplies from the mission warehouse. These donations enable the recipient institutions to expand their services or upgrade their equipment to serve their communities.

Steve retired from Florida Hospital in 2014, but he continued to serve as a volunteer with AdventHealth Global Missions going on mission trips with his bride, Virginia, and helping in the mission warehouse. Steve was affectionately known as the Godfather of Global Missions, a title that speaks to his influence and dedication to this work. In Peru, he was called “Papa Yancey”. In the Philippines, he was called “Sir Steve”. Everyone knew him as a man of God. The impact of his service to others cannot be measured because it is still ongoing. Rest in peace, Steve Yancey. Your kindness, compassion and dedication to helping others will not be forgotten.

Warehouse in Action

In 2022, AdventHealth Global Missions had an outstanding year in terms of warehouse activities, achieving record-setting levels. We shipped a total of 70 consignments to 23 different countries, with 19 shipments filling full-size sea containers. This significant accomplishment demonstrates our commitment to fulfilling our mission of providing medical supplies to underprivileged communities worldwide. These shipments included PPE materials to countries dealing with pandemic challenges, hospital beds, computers, imaging equipment and so much more. We are proud to have played a part in improving the health and well-being of countless individuals around the world.

Our local volunteer program continued to grow and thrive in 2022. Thanks to the efforts of our dedicated team and community support, we were able to host over 100 volunteers in our mission warehouse to sort donated medical supplies. These volunteers played a vital role in ensuring that all of our shipments were efficiently and effectively prepared for transport. We are grateful for their contributions and remain committed to expanding our volunteer program in the years to come. Our continued success would not be possible without the hard work and dedication of our team and volunteers, and we look forward to continuing to serve communities in need around the world.

Disaster Response

While AdventHealth is not a disaster response organization, we do respond when disaster strikes communities where we serve, or where we have Global Mission relationships. Last year, Global Missions responded to help with floods in Kentucky and the conflict in Ukraine.

Kentucky Floods

At least three AdventHealth team members were left homeless and at least a dozen more lost cars or suffered devastating damage after record floods surged over the banks of the North Fork Kentucky River — not far from where AdventHealth Manchester, a 49-bed acute care hospital, serves this rural part of Kentucky..

The recent floods are the second major flooding event in Eastern Kentucky during the past 18 months. Neither the hospital nor the AdventHealth primary care clinic in nearby Oneida suffered damage, but a number of team members, patients and their families are struggling to put their lives back together.

In response, more than 1,200 team members at other AdventHealth hospitals across seven states rallied to help not only colleagues they have never met, but the entire eastern Kentucky region devastated by the heavy storms and floods.

AdventHealth team members contributed more than \$96,000 through payroll donations, and additional funds were donated via the Global Missions website to help the communities.

“Everybody just jumped in together to make sure we could support this,” said Monty Jacobs, director of Global Missions for AdventHealth. “Our team members have tremendous compassion, and some of our families lost everything.”

AdventHealth also provided a significant gift to support employees and the communities impacted by the flooding. The money helped to fund families in need through individual grants as they look to rebuild their lives. Funds were also used to provide transportation to ensure people have access to health care services. Working with community partners, more than 20,000 meals and other supplies were delivered to Kentucky to help families recover from this catastrophe.

“As our mission calls us to do, our AdventHealth team stands ready to help in distressing times like these. We are partnering with the local health department on rescue efforts, arranging transportation and collecting funds for essential needs such as clothing, shoes, personal care products, non-perishable foods and more,” said AdventHealth President and CEO Terry Shaw.

Ukraine

Oleg Kostyuk, a religious studies professor at AdventHealth University, told the story of encountering a woman on Ukraine's border with Romania. She had fled Odessa, her life packed into two carry-on suitcases. The thing she would miss most, she told him, was not her home but rather the ability to visit the graves of her husband and son. Kostyuk and his wife, Julia, a family nurse practitioner, visited AdventHealth's Global Missions office in Altamonte Springs, Florida to share the hope (and heartbreak) they experienced during their six-day visit to their war-torn homeland to deliver "seven huge suitcases" of medicines and supplies.

"The war brings the best and the worst in humanity," Oleg said. "We saw many people where the best was shining through in them. People are filled with love and joy, in spite of everything, and hope in peace."

The Kostyuk's efforts are among a growing list of those that have taken place since the war began in February, 2022. As the war has continued, so has AdventHealth's ongoing support of the relief efforts in Ukraine. More than 2,200 people have contributed over \$230,000 via payroll donations from AdventHealth team members.

Team member donations helped buy and equip three vans for use as mobile clinics by Angelia Adventist Clinic in Kyiv, Ukraine. Global Missions continues to put funds raised to work — helping cover the cost of medications and other needed medical supplies.

Donations also have allowed AdventHealth to provide direct relief to refugees for food and other necessities, working through partners on the ground in Ukraine.

More than 2,200 people have contributed over \$230,000 via payroll donations from AdventHealth team members.

New Footprints

Paraguay

In early 2022, AdventHealth signed an agreement to cooperate on medical initiatives with Sanatorio Adventista de Asunción and Sanatorio Adventista de Hohenau, Paraguay. This agreement established these hospitals as our 12th footprint. AdventHealth first connected with the two hospitals when Paraguayan nurses were invited to the annual nursing conference, organized by AdventHealth Global Missions, to connect with nurses from other mission footprints and expand their clinical knowledge.

Communication and joint activities between the two institutions continued sporadically, due to the pandemic, until 2022, when leaders from the AdventHealth Southwest Region and AdventHealth Global Missions visited the two hospitals to launch the conversation that would result in a signed cooperation agreement.

“Though the hospitals themselves are set in vastly different areas of the country, the passion for excellence and quality was evident in the people from each location,” said Penny Johnson, President and CEO of AdventHealth in the Southwest Region. “We spoke with some patients in the Hohenau hospital, and they shared that they would drive two hours to the Hohenau facility because they preferred the faith-based care and service received there.”



Kevin Roberts, CEO of AdventHealth Central Texas and AdventHealth Rollins Brook, said the Paraguay hospitals are well established and modern with great potential to deepen their impact in the communities they serve. AdventHealth’s role will be to help accelerate their mission within their communities through supporting the acquisition of modern equipment, consulting on quality and leadership, and providing medical-team outreach into rural communities.

“Knowing that the leaders within the organization make personal contributions to support this ministry is also inspiring and vital to success,” said Roberts.

“We’ve always had a heart for mission in this region. We just didn’t have a mission footprint until now,” said Johnson. “We will be just as blessed by this partnership as the two hospitals in Paraguay will be.”

Chile

In late 2022, AdventHealth expanded its international partnerships to Chile by welcoming two new institutions to the Global Missions program, including Clínica Adventista de Los Angeles - CLINALA and Universidad Adventista de Chile - UnACh, to form the 13th partnership of the program. This is the first time a university has been officially included in the relationship.

“It’s really great that we have the opportunity to partner with the Adventist Church and its health and higher learning institutions,” said Jennifer Wandersleben, Regional President and CEO of AdventHealth in West Florida. “We can share best practices with one another and enhance the care we deliver to our communities.”

The relationship between the institutions was officially launched when Wandersleben traveled to Chile in December with an AdventHealth delegation, which included Jason Newmyer, president and CEO of AdventHealth Riverview, and Monty Jacobs, Director for Global Missions. Wandersleben and Newmyer serve as the executive sponsors for this partnership, and both feel a connection to Chile through family ties and Newmyer’s Hispanic heritage.

“It’s a blessing to serve abroad as it showcases our commitment to humanity and fellow Christian brothers and sisters in other parts of the world,” said Newmyer.



The partnership will focus on seven core areas.

1. Exchanging clinical education content in areas including patient safety and quality assurance
2. Improving clinical and operational processes
3. Supporting education and training for physicians and clinical staff
4. Developing strategies for health care occupations experiencing shortage
5. Exploring research opportunities
6. Sharing equipment and supplies
7. Enhancing delivery of the partners’ common faith-based mission and focus on whole-person care

Special Highlights

Operation Sunshine

Operation Sunshine was established with a mission to provide health care to children living in orphanages in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Working alongside My Neighbor's Children — a Florida-based non-profit group — orphanages and group homes in Haiti were identified to participate in this program, with 500+ children enrolled to date. In 2019, all volunteer trips to Haiti were postponed due to political unrest and then the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite our travel restrictions, Haiti Adventist Hospital provides health care, including physician consultations, medications, laboratory tests and hospitalization for the children.

AdventHealth Global Missions remains committed to the Operation Sunshine program in Haiti for the health and wellbeing of the children enrolled in the program and will continue to work with Haiti Adventist Hospital to ensure the children receive care.

AdventHealth Global Missions has expanded the Operation Sunshine program to an additional country. Peru is our first area of expansion. Clinica Good Hope in Lima, Peru has built and funded a children's clinic called "Servicio Social" where children are enrolled and can receive free healthcare from birth until they are 18 years old. AdventHealth sent its first team of pediatric residents and faculty to work at the Servicio Social Clinic in December. They were able to conduct wellness checks, provide dental exams and apply fluoride to several hundred children during their stay.

Salud Total: Peru – Total Health Project

In the Amazonian rainforest of Peru, access to health care is extremely limited. Without regular visits to a primary health care provider, preventable illnesses such as dysentery and anemia become public health threats. Proper nutrition and personal hygiene practices, such as hand washing are critical to survival, yet villages continue to struggle with these simple, life changing tasks. At the same time, villages face behavioral health challenges such as alcoholism, domestic violence, and the devastating psychological impact of COVID-19. Without access to providers, villagers are at much higher risk for long-term health complications.

Thanks to the Total Health program, or Salud Total as it is known in Peru, Centura Health's Global Health Initiatives is working to change this norm. In partnership with the Universidad Peruana Unión and Clinica Adventista Ana Stahl in Iquitos, this program focuses on educating the public through supervised student health interns. The interns immerse themselves in the communities, spending one year offering nursing, psychology and nutrition education. They are embedded in a village where they work directly with individuals and families, empowering them with the skills and knowledge to take charge of their health. Two villages have benefited from the Total Health program and the goal is to expand the program to more communities, if funds permit.

Celebrating Our Donors

The work of AdventHealth Global Missions depends on philanthropy to make a greater impact. The support that we provide to our footprints is primarily divided into four areas: community medical outreach with volunteer medical teams, cash gifts from donors to help with specific projects or programs, knowledge exchange, and in-kind donations of equipment and supplies. AdventHealth Global Missions does not provide unrestricted funds to support general operations of our footprint partners.

We are extremely appreciative of our volunteers and donors who allow us to make a difference for those in need. Our volunteers donate their time and money to go on our medical mission trips to provide care to others. Often, the care is being provided to communities that lack regular access to basic healthcare services or specialty services. The willingness of our volunteers to serve others is a true embodiment of living our mission. AdventHealth Global Missions also receives support from donors who provide funding for additional projects and programs that provide needed services. Through these gifts, children receive healthcare through our Operation Sunshine program and patients obtain diagnostic services through imaging equipment like x-ray or CT that have been donated through AdventHealth. Those are just a couple of the areas where our donors are making a difference. Each year, AdventHealth Global Missions raises more than \$1,000,000 to help fund these projects and programs with our footprints.



In 2022, Global Missions made over 70 shipments of medical supplies and equipment to 23 different countries.

The other two areas where AdventHealth provides support to our footprints are through knowledge exchange and in-kind donations. These occur from within AdventHealth, and our Global Missions team helps coordinate those activities by conducting a regular global nursing conference and other educational programs with our footprints. Likewise, the Global Missions team also organizes the receipt of medical equipment and supplies and matches them up to requests received from our footprints. In 2022, Global Missions made over 70 shipments of medical supplies and equipment to 23 different countries.
