#### **Shoe Covering**

Published studies assessing the presence of COVID-19 in a cohort intensive care unit (ICU) and general ward found the virus was widely distributed on the floor and present on half of the team members' soles. Team members entering the cohort may choose to wear shoes exclusive to the cohort unit/ward and must disinfect them appropriately. If team members wear their shoes to other parts of the hospital, the recommendation is to wear shoe covers in cohort units concurrently with N95 respirator use. Additionally, facilities may place a disinfectant mat at points of entry/exit to the cohort unit/ward.

## **Health Information Exchange (HIE) Cerner Update**

HIE is the secure and electronic sharing of health information that allows AdventHealth providers to appropriately access a patient's vital medical information electronically from

internal and external sources. Patient consent is required for the information to be shared.

In order to make it easy for providers and nurses to find outside laboratory test results for COVID-19 patients, the HIE search function has been updated within <u>iConnect</u> and <u>iExtend</u>.

## **COVID-19 Convalescent Plasma Infusion Subphase Cerner Update**

The COVID-19 Convalescent Plasma Infusion Subphase within <u>iConnect</u> is a new subphase to be embedded into the COVID-19 Core Content PowerPlan and is also available as a stand-alone order. The subphase utilizes the Expanded Access Program (the Mayo Clinic Protocol) to source convalescent plasma for the treatment of COVID-19 patients. ### **Provider Documentation for COVID-19 Patients Cerner Update**

In order to make it easy for providers regarding COVID-19 documentation, we have created notes for ICU history and physical examinations (H&Ps) and progress notes within iConnect and iExtend.

In the wake of rapid developments with COVID-19 outbreaks, it is important to keep our team of physicians, advanced practice professionals, nurses, pharmacy technicians and respiratory therapists updated. On **Wednesday, April 22, from 6:00 to 7:00 pm EST**, the COVID-19 Multidisciplinary Information Session IV will be live-streamed. Vincent Hsu, MD, hospital epidemiologist and director of Infection Prevention, will host the event with a panel discussion on clinical update, testing and convalescent plasma therapy.
