Clinical leaders are providing frequent updates to all clinicians in an effort to keep you current about AdventHealth's response to COVID-19. The following topics are included in this brief:

Antigen Testing Recommendation

Based on federal, external and internal validation studies, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) emergency use authorization (EUA) antigen tests (Quidel or BD Veritor) can be used for **symptomatic** patients (ED, Observation, IP) where there is clinical suspicion of COVID-19. If the antigen test result is **positive**, it is considered positive and they are treated as such. If the test result is **negative**, they will be considered a person under investigation (PUI), a PCR will be obtained and a result will follow. The patient who is PCR-tested must be treated as a symptomatic PUI as clinically indicated until the PCR is resulted.

The test would require a comment: "the sensitivity is low and all negative test results should be confirmed with PCR as clinically indicated."

Until further discussion and consensus is reached, the antigen test should not be used for asymptomatic or pre-admission testing (PAT).

Lab directors will have to be involved to supervise deployment of this test at individual facilities.
