#### INFORMATION FOR ALL CLINICIANS

Clinical leaders are providing frequent updates to all clinicians in an effort to keep you current about AdventHealth's response to COVID-19. The following topics are included in this brief:

- Crisis Standards of Care Documentation
- Contingency and Crisis Staffing: ICU, PCU and Med/Surg
- Approved Alternative Disinfectant Wipe Brand

#### **Crisis Standards of Care Documentation**

The Crisis Standards of Care Documentation guidelines and SOP developed for iConnect and iExtend provide charting instructions in the event of a pervasive or catastrophic disaster resulting in a substantial change in health care operations and the level of care that is possible to deliver. The crisis documentation is designed to streamline charting and allow the nurse more focused time for the care of patients. The process would be authorized and invoked by the System Command Center.

When using Crisis Standards of Care Documentation, nurses will have pocket cards provided for use, which will identify specific documentation required in iConnect and in iExtend. Communication of crisis standards will come from the System Command Center, and will be cascaded using AdventHealth Alerts by Everbridge, nursing leadership and unit huddles.

# Contingency and Crisis Staffing: ICU, PCU and Med/Surg

This communication provides a refresher of our established pandemic contingency and crisis RN staffing models. Staffing models for contingency and crisis staffing use a team-based approach for med/surg units and for the ICU as an alternative to our conventional staffing models for use when resources are impacted by an emergency. The ICU model is based on the staffing model endorsed by the Society of Critical Care Medicine.

Prepare teams by using the <u>med/surg</u> and <u>ICU</u> crisis staffing models in conjunction with the <u>redeployment toolkits</u>.

# **Approved Alternative Disinfectant Wipe Brand**

Due to shifting supply availability, the **Cavicide Wipe** brand has been procured for use as an alternative to **PDI** purple-top brand wipes. These wipes **must** be prioritized for use in direct patient care settings.

For surface disinfection in areas that **do not** provide direct patient care, such as business settings, supplies will be provided according to this CDC resource, which allows the use of alternative disinfectant wipes when EPA-approved wipes are not available. This includes:

- Cleaner/disinfectant in spray bottles to be used with cloths or paper towels
- Alternative disinfectant wipes

Examples of alternative disinfectants for areas that do not provide direct patient care can be seen below:
